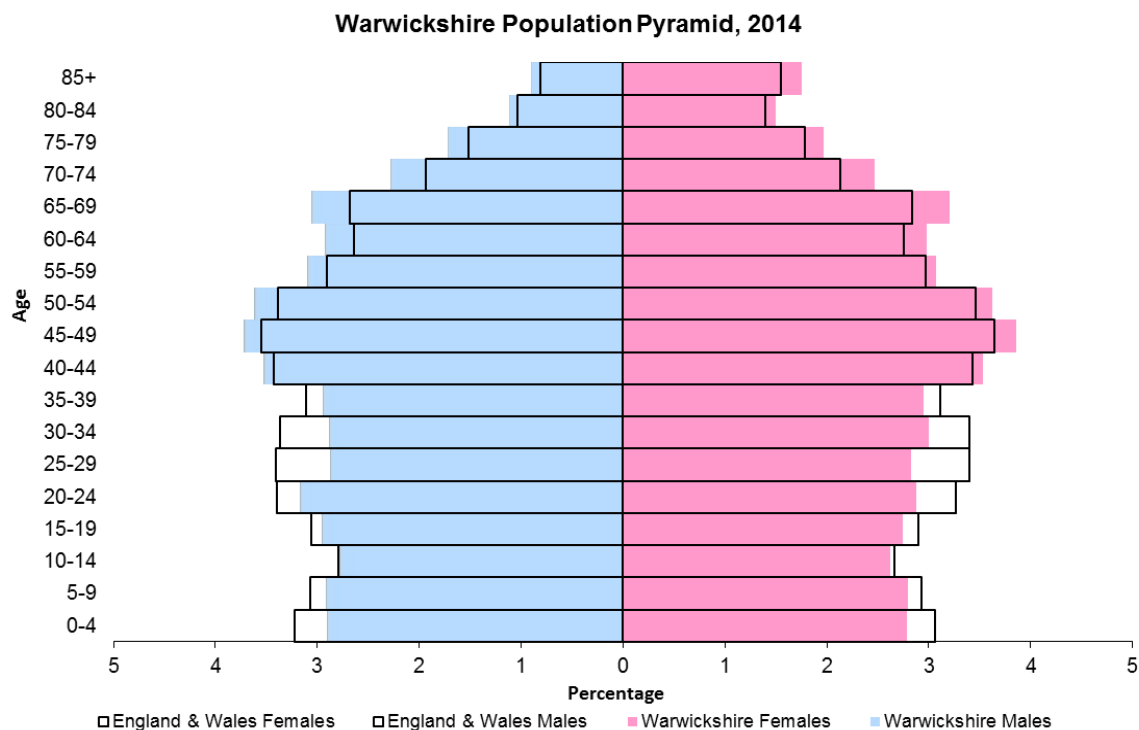

*A number of household surveys have sought to provide estimates of the proportion of individuals who identify as lesbian, gay or bisexual. Recent ONS work produced a figure of 1.5% of the population. However, other surveys suggest higher rates. For this reason a range of rates are used based on current population data.

Age and Sex

An aging population.....overall, Warwickshire's population pyramid shows a slightly older age profile than the national picture; it is over represented in all age groups over the age of 40 while the younger age groups are underrepresented. The proportion of men and women is broadly similar up to the age of 65+ where women make up 55% of the resident population.

Disability and Health

Higher than average levels of 'good' health.....In Warwickshire, 82% of residents described their health as 'good' or 'very good' in line with national trends. However, there is variation around the county and some areas record lower levels of 'good' health particularly in the north of the county.

Similarly, levels of disability, as measured through the census, are slightly lower countywide than those experienced nationally. However, levels of disability vary around the county with some areas recording both higher and lower levels.

Ethnicity, Country of birth, language and religion

Increasingly diverse in some parts of the county.....The 'White British' ethnic group accounted for 88.5 % of the population in 2011, a fall from 92.7% in the previous 2001 census. Warwickshire's next largest ethnic groups are 'Other White' and 'Indian' who each make up around 3% of the population.

Warwickshire has 8.3% of residents born outside of the UK - below the national average of 13.4%. The largest groups of non-UK born residents are from Poland and India. Residents whose country of birth was Poland increased from around 500 in 2001 to nearly 6000 in 2011.

After English, the main languages spoken by residents in Warwickshire are Polish, Punjabi and Gujarati although there are local variations to these.

Overall, Warwickshire experienced a decline in Christian religious affiliations and an increase in residents stating they have 'no religion'. The latter now account for around 1 in 4 people. However, Christian is still the largest religious group at 64.5% of residents. The next largest groups are Sikh, Muslim and Hindu.
