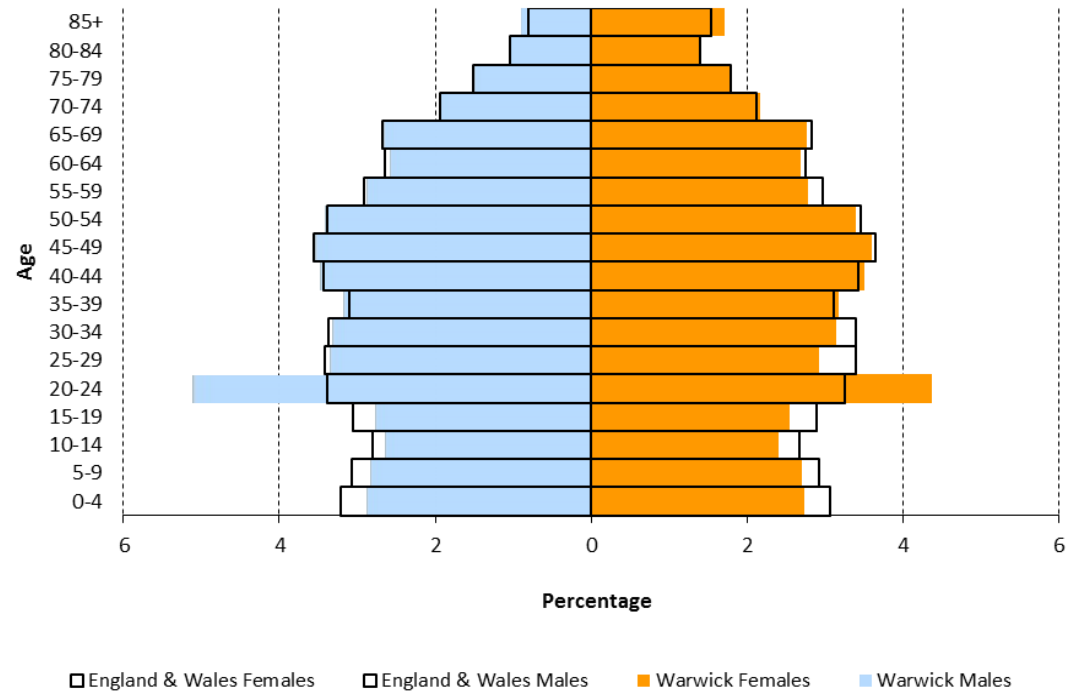

*A number of household surveys have sought to provide estimates of the proportion of individuals who identify as lesbian, gay or bisexual. Recent ONS work produced a figure of 1.5% of the population. However, other surveys suggest higher rates. For this reason a range of rates are used based on current population data.

Key Messages

Age and Sex

A less markedly aging population.... Warwick District's population pyramid, unlike elsewhere in the county, is more closely aligned with the national picture - it has the lowest proportion of 65+ residents compared with other districts/boroughs.

Warwick's student population is reflected in the over-representation of young people aged 20-24 years.

Disability and Health

Levels of 'good' health and disability are in line with county average.....In Warwick District, 84.5% of residents described their health as 'good' or 'very good' - above county and national trends.

Similarly, levels of disability, as measured through the census, are slightly lower than those experienced countywide and nationally.

Ethnicity, Country of birth, language and religion

More diversity than elsewhere in the county....in Warwick District the 'White British' ethnic group accounted for 83.4% of the population in 2011 - the lowest of all boroughs/districts. The district's next largest ethnic group is 'Indian' at 4.9% of residents followed by 'Other White' who make up 4.2% of the population.

In Warwick District, just over 1 in 10 residents are recorded as being born outside of the UK. This rate is above the county level but still below the national picture. The most prevalent non-UK country of birth in the district is India followed by Ireland and Poland.

After English, the main languages spoken by residents are Punjabi and Polish. Across the district, 1,308 residents are recorded as not being able to speak English well or at all.

Around 58.3% of residents identified themselves as 'Christian' - the lowest proportion in the county. After this, the largest religious group is Sikh at 3.9% followed by Hindu at 1.2% and Muslim (0.9%). The district has the highest proportion of residents with 'no religious' affiliation.
