

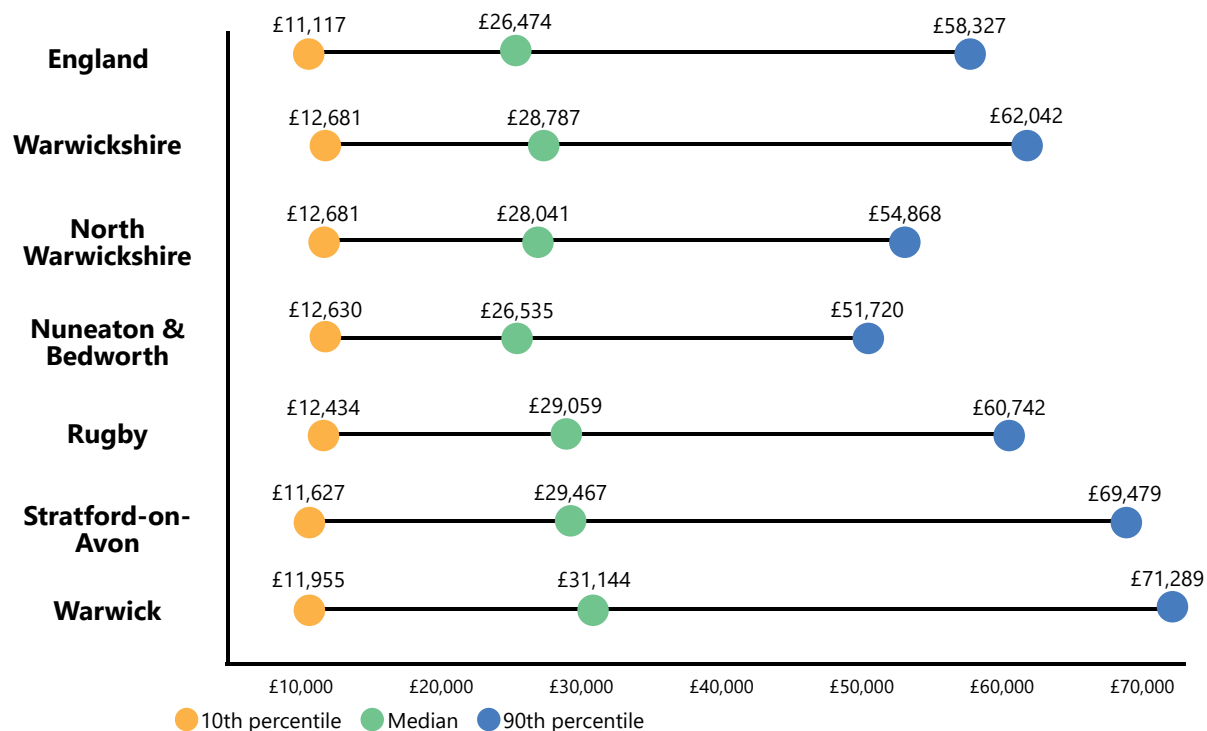
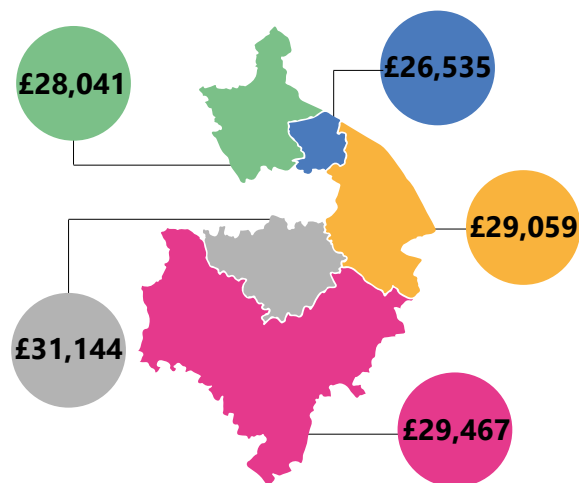
Briefing Note - Admin-based Income Statistics (ABIS)

The highest median equivalised gross household PAYE and benefits income in Warwickshire in 2015/16 was **Warwick District**

10% of households in Warwick District earn more than £71,289 - the highest 90th percentile figure

The lowest median equivalised gross household PAYE and benefits income in Warwickshire in 2015/16 was **Nuneaton & Bedworth Borough**

10% of households earn more than £51,720 - significantly lower than the equivalent figure for Warwick District



The chart above shows the equivalised gross households PAYE and benefits income for the tax year 2015/16, by borough / district (as well as the county and national figures). The 10th percentile (90% of households earn more than this figure) and 90th percentile (10% of households earn more than this figure) of PAYE and benefits income are also shown. There was more variation in the difference between the boroughs and districts at the 90th percentile than at the 10th percentile.

Summary

The admin-based income statistics (AMIS) bring together data from the Pay As You Earn (PAYE) and benefit systems to derive small-area estimates of net and gross income for the 2015/16 tax year.

The ABIS are defined as experimental statistics, because both the income measure and coverage are currently incomplete; therefore these statistics have limited use for decision-making. Instead, the ABIS demonstrate the potential to produce small area income statistics from administrative data to allow some interim evaluation to be made (taking their partial coverage into account). They also allow us to start comparing administrative data-based estimates with other survey-based household income statistics.
