Summary



The Local Tobacco Control Profiles for England provides a snapshot of the extent of tobacco use, tobacco related harm, and measures being taken to reduce this harm at a local level. These profiles have been designed to help local government and health services to assess the effect of tobacco use on their local populations. They will inform commissioning and planning decisions to tackle tobacco use and improve the health of local communities.

The tool allows you to compare your local authority against other local authorities in the region and benchmark your local authority against the England or regional average.

This update contains:

- 8 indicator updates

The tobacco control profiles are part of a series of products produced by Public Health England providing local data alongside national comparisons to support local health improvement.

The next update will be on Tuesday 1st August 2017.

Key Facts – Warwickshire

- Warwickshire performs significantly better than England for 19 of the 43 indicators. Performance is at a similar level for 23 indicators and significantly worse for 1 indicator.

Key Facts – Warwickshire Districts/Boroughs

- Stratford-on-Avon District is the best performing lower tier local authority, across the West Midlands, for 3 indicators.
- Warwick District is the best performing lower tier local authority for: Smoking prevalence in adults – never smoked (APS) – (64.8%) and Smoking prevalence in adults in routine and manual occupations – current smokers (IHS) – (14.9%)
