



What does the service offer?

Compass Young Person's Service provides a peripatetic, confidential, targeted & specialist support to young people under the age of 18 who are using or at risk of using drugs and alcohol.

At Compass Warwickshire, young people from any background can access a full range of specially developed services and practical support to help them tackle issues associated with their own or another person's substance misuse.

Children and young people aged up to 18 can access the services directly, or through one of the many local community, voluntary or faith groups the service works with.

The service has vast experience of helping young people from many different backgrounds, including homeless children and young sex workers.

For certain young people the service can be extended up to the age of 24. It is recognised that for a young person, accessing adult services can be a daunting and challenging prospect. That is why they have developed the services to cater for young adults suffering from the issues associated with substance misuse.



The support they provide is flexible and based on individual needs and responsibilities. The experienced professionals can help with the transition into adult services, where appropriate, ensuring individuals make the journey at a pace that suits them.
