ESH Works provides mutual support for those addicted to or affected by alcohol, drugs or other dependencies. They offer involvement and volunteering opportunities for people with personal experience of addiction who want to help make a difference.

ESH Works has a team of volunteers who are able to pass on their own personal experience of addiction to others who are currently in the same position as they once were.

The letters ESH represent the **E**xperience, **S**trength and **H**ope which addicts and their families who have lived through the issues and found a solution can give to support people who are still experiencing addiction problems.

Our focus as an organisation is on recovery from addiction and we believe that the support necessary is most effective when it is led by people who themselves have experienced the problems and found a solution.
