What does the service offer?

The Recovery Partnership provide services for people aged 18 and over living in Warwickshire, who have issues with alcohol or drugs. The service provides support to individuals who are experiencing problems with a range of substances, such as regulated illicit substances, unregulated substances (legal highs), steroids and other image and performance enhancing drugs, solvents and alcohol.

The service is free and confidential and available countywide. The Recovery Partnership has bases in Leamington, Stratford, Rugby and Nuneaton and also operates at numerous satellite venues.

The service offers a variety of options, including:

- Open access information and advice - anyone can walk in from the street and be seen
- Harm minimisation advice
- Needle Exchange
- Blood Borne Virus prevention and treatment (including screening and vaccinations)
- Criminal Justice Interventions
- Hospital Liaison
- Structured Psychosocial Interventions
- Pharmacotherapy (prescribing)
- In-patient and community detoxification (drug and alcohol) and access to Residential Rehabilitation
- Structured day programmes (group work)
- Employment Support

Recent Updates and good news:

The steroid clinic set up at the Recovery Partnership in Leamington to help address the growing issue of image and performance enhancing drugs (I PEDs) featured as a news story on BBC Midlands Today. Members of the team were interviewed and were able to promote appropriate safety messages and the service in general.
