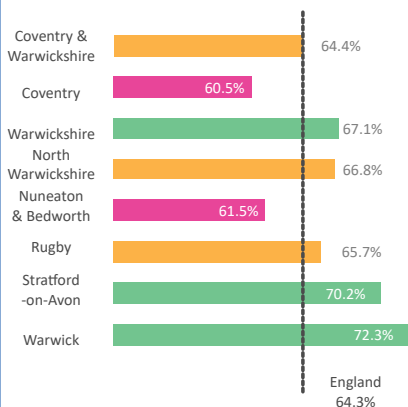

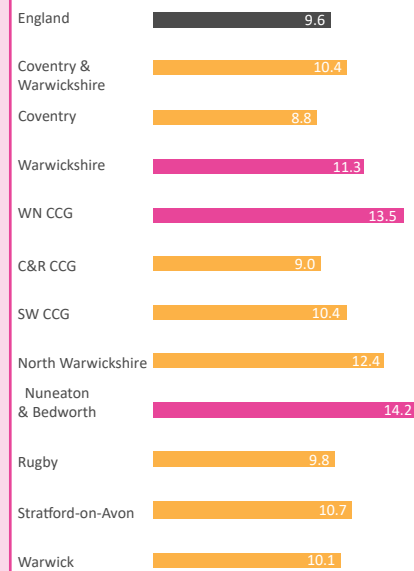

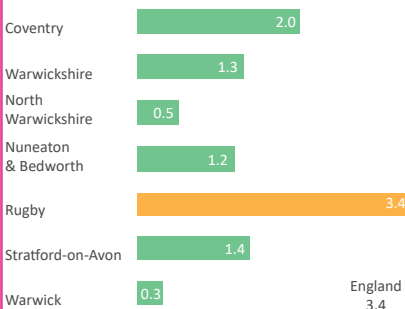
Homelessness

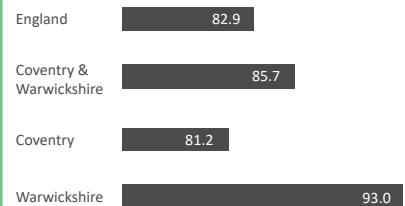
Rehabilitation

The proportion of older people (aged 65 and over) who were still at home 91 days after discharge from hospital into reablement/ rehabilitation services

93% of people in Warwickshire were still at home 91 days after leaving reablement, well ahead of the national average of 82.9%. Coventry is just behind the national average at 81.2%.

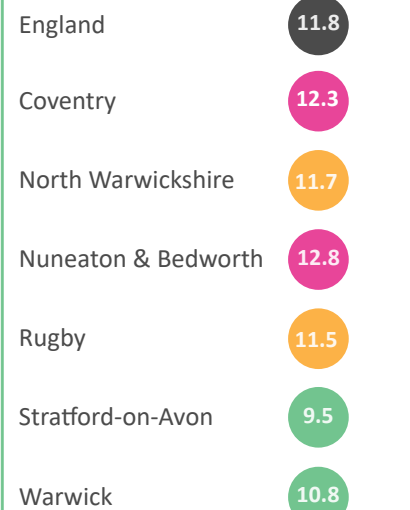

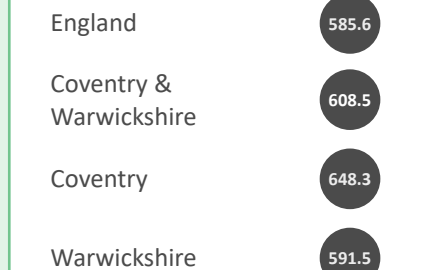
Residential care

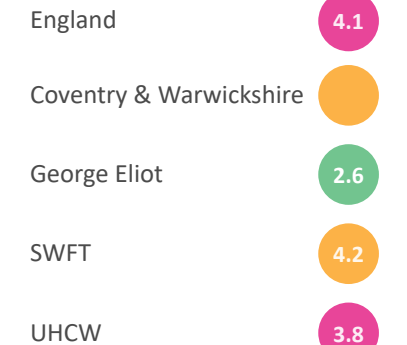
