Warwickshire Police provided an update on activity since the last meeting of the Forum. Key issues to arise were:

- a) Off Road Biking
- b) Parking around Schools
- c) Speeding

The Safer Neighbourhood Team said they will focus on Haunchwood Road, Kingswood Road and Wycliffe Way for speed checks between 11-7pm and before school times on Wycliffe Way

It was suggested by a resident that speeding warning were not working and people needed to be fined.

Electronic operated advisory solar speed warning signs were suggested as an option to prevent speeding.

Gypsy and Traveller encampments are becoming an increasing issues, however procedures are in place to deal with any issues.

Square Pegs Stay and Play The family support group is every 3rd Saturday at Stockingford Community Centre from 11:30-1:30 and includes cake, coffee and a relaxed atmosphere. Most families who attend have a little one going through the many years long and expensive process of being diagnosed for autism, frequently ending with a discharge with no diagnosis and then struggling to cope
